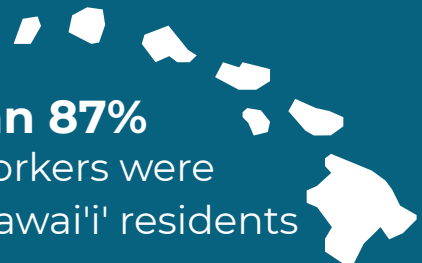

Disney worked with four Hawai'i-based organizations to rethink traditional production practices and embed sustainability throughout the production process:



- **80%** of on-set waste diverted from landfills and reused in the community.
- **18,000 pounds** of food scraps and compostable packaging sent to be transformed into nutrient-rich soil used to grow local product.
- **More than 3,500 pounds** of surplus food donated, providing the equivalent of two years' worth of meals for one person.
- Props, lumber, and set materials found new life with local nonprofits and schools after filming wrapped.
